Playwright Ben Jonson declared William Shakespeare "not of an age, but for all time," for he gives life to emotions and thoughts that are inherent to the human condition. In the belief that Shakespeare should not be restricted to the past, our goal is to tell the story in a way that eliminates the distance and formidability often associated with the Bard, infusing his brilliant words with imagination and spontaneity, and transcending fixed time. We embrace theatricality and a sense of play.

Once again, this production is dedicated to the memory of Tom Byrne, who loved Shakespeare and inspired others to do the same.

The STORY

ACT ONE. The story opens with strife between two brothers. Orlando, the son of the late Sir Roland, is lamenting to his servant, Ada, that his elder brother, Oliver, has relegated him to a life of labor. Oliver has paid for their middle sibling's education, but has refused to allow Orlando to seek an education or a life of substance. Oliver enters, and an altercation ensues. When Oliver learns that Orlando will challenge the formidable wrestler, Charles, he urges Charles to kill Orlando.

Meanwhile, in another part of the realm, Rosalind and Celia also face the aftermath of sibling rivalry. Celia's father, Duke Frederick, has usurped the throne of his brother, Duke Senior, who is Rosalind's father. Duke Frederick has allowed Rosalind to stay in the palace because she and her cousin, Celia, are so close. The cousins witness the upset at the wrestling match, during which Orlando beats Charles. Rosalind and Orlando meet and are instantly attracted to each other.

Duke Frederick has a change of heart and decides that Rosalind must be banished. Celia cannot bear to live without her, so the cousins plan an escape to the Forest of Arden. Rosalind will dress as a boy named Ganymede, and Celia will dress as Ganymede's sister, Aliena. They recruit the court fool, Touchstone, to accompany them.

ACT TWO. Oliver is furious that Orlando was victorious, and Ada warns Orlando to flee his brother's wrath, entreating Orlando to let her go along to serve. Duke Frederick is outraged to hear that the girls have fled. Having reason to believe that Rosalind and Celia are in the company of Orlando, he orders Oliver to find Orlando on penalty of forfeiting all of his possessions if the runaways are not found.

In the forest, Duke Senior has assembled a merry band and has learned to love the simplicity and clarity of country life. One of his band is the melancholy Jacques, who amuses the Duke because of his contrary outlook. Rosalind, Celia, and Touchstone arrive in the forest and are able to buy a cottage with the assistance of the good shepherd, Corin. Orlando and Ada also arrive in the forest. The aged Ada is suffering from exhaustion and hunger. When Orlando sets out to find a food, he comes upon Duke Senior and his band. Despite an unfortunate introduction, Orlando, Ada, and the Duke's band become friends.

ACT THREE. Orlando pines for Rosalind and hangs notes in the forest to the love he believes he will never see again. Rosalind and Celia find the notes and discover that Orlando is the writer. Still dressed as Ganymede, Rosalind confronts Orlando and offers to tutor him in the ways of love. Orlando agrees to pretend that Ganymede is Rosalind and to practice wooing.

There are still more love matches in the forest. Touchstone has fallen in love with the tempting shepherdess, Audrey. A shepherd named Silvius is deeply in love with a country girl named Phoebe. Phoebe, wanting nothing to do with Silvius, sees young Ganymede (Rosalind) and promptly falls in love. Rosalind negotiates an agreement whereby if Phoebe finds a reason why Ganymede is ill-suited for her, Phoebe will marry Silvius.

ACT FOUR. Oliver has set out for the magical forest in hopes of finding Orlando and narrowly escapes being bitten by a snake. It is Orlando who saves him; in the course of the rescue, Orlando is attacked by a lion. Because of his injury, Orlando has asked Oliver to find Ganymede and explain his absence from the daily lesson. Oliver repents from his wicked ways, and he and Celia fall in love at first sight.

ACT FIVE. A wedding for all four couples closes the play. Rosalind and her father are reunited, and – to make the ending even more sweet – Orlando and Oliver's sibling comes to the forest to tell the company that Duke Frederick has converted to a religious life and returned the dukedom to Duke Senior. All ends merrily in the Forest of Arden.
