A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Hello, and welcome to *Small Mouth Sounds*! Our cast and crew have been hard at work over the last six weeks, bringing this unique story to life in all of its rich and beautiful detail. We were faced with one challenge in particular that the script presents - the characters are attending a silent retreat, and are not allowed to speak.
