The videotaping or other video or audio recording of this production is strictly prohibited. We know that, for many of you, taking performance photos or video of your loved ones is a huge temptation. Please respect this rule of theatre etiquette and resist! Phone use during a show is distracting to actors and audience members and is disrespectful of our creative property. Live theatre is meant to be temporal – let it be just that. Thank you!

Since then, Charlie has been in many Shakespeare and Shakespeare-adjacent plays, including Merely Players productions of Macbeth, Much Ado About Nothing, and most recently, The Book of Will. Jeni Hartmann (Francisco/Player/Gentlewoman/Ensemble) never knew that watching the Merely Players production of The Book of Will last year would lead to her being on this stage in Hamlet. Encouragement from her husband Shawn, her father-In-law Raul, her sister Signe, and Diane Panelli gave her the strength to audition. She appreciates the open and accepting atmosphere created by the Merely community including those on and off stage. Geoff Johnson (Laertes/Guildenstern) has been in numerous Shakespeare plays and has even understood large chunks of those shows. This summer he took a brief respite from acting to play 3rd base in rec softball. He managed a perfect 0% batting average and nearly contributed as many outs as errors. Recent Merely credits include: Nicely Nicely in Guys & Dolls, Ben Jonson & others in The Book of Will, and performed the one man show Jacob Marley's Christmas Carol. Geoff is thrilled once again to share the stage with his bodacious bride Mohriah James. The fool doth think he is wise, but the wise man knows himself to be a fool.

Mary-Catherine McAlvany (Dance/Combat Choreographer) wants to live in a world with people singing and dancing in TSA line, books bundled with coupons for coffee dates with the author, and an invisibility shield she wears while choreographing an entire show in a house of constantly inquiring, fussy people! She's Executive Director of Wildwood Dance Project, a mother of four sarcastic kids, and an Arts Strategist with a global think tank. Her first brush with the Bard with in high school as Ophelia. With Merely Players, she later choreographed for "the play which shall not be named." She studied philosophy and theology at Boston College, and encounters everyone with Ophelia's visional ethics: We know what we are, but not what we may be.

With Merely, she has played Audrey in *As You Like It*, a slate of magic-charged beings in *The Tempest*, and Shakespeare's daughter AND lover in *Book of Will* last year. Nothing brings her greater joy than swimming around in Shakespeare's verses, especially with fellow Bardophiles. She looks forward to many more frolics in the Folio with these players and dreams of someday writing a play in iambic pentameter. *Ay, much is the force of heaven-bred poesy*.

Kathleen McGee (*Costume Designer*) is currently the Head Draper in the Theatre Department at Fort Lewis College and has worked on over twelve productions there. She teaches sewing and constructs the more complicated works of art worn by the actors. Before moving to Durango, she taught garment construction and was on the board at Jacqui Burke's Fashion School, was Wardrobe Supervisor at the Dunbar Lyric Group, and was an apprentice Kiltmaker, all in Scotland. The STORY

Claudius has seized the throne of Denmark by marrying Queen Gertrude, the widow of his late brother. Prince Hamlet, still grieving his father's death, is unsettled by this swift union. His unease deepens when the ghost of King Hamlet appears, declaring that Claudius murdered him to gain the crown. The revelation ignites a storm of grief, anger, and doubt within the young prince.

Unsure whom to trust and torn between duty and despair, Hamlet feigns madness to mask his suspicions. His erratic behavior unsettles the court, especially Ophelia, the young woman he loves, who is caught between her loyalty to her father, Polonius, and her affection for Hamlet. Meanwhile, Claudius summons Hamlet's old friends, Rosencrantz and Guildenstern, hoping they will spy on him and uncover the cause of his strange behavior.

When a troupe of actors arrives at Elsinore, Hamlet seizes the opportunity to stage a play that mirrors the king's crime. Claudius's guilty reaction convinces Hamlet of his uncle's treachery. In a confrontation with his mother, Hamlet mistakenly kills Polonius. This act deepens the tragedy, shattering Ophelia's sanity and fueling her brother Laertes's thirst for revenge.

Denmark slides into chaos as Claudius plots to rid himself of Hamlet once and for all. He sends Hamlet to England in the company of Rosencrantz and Guildenstern, bearing sealed orders for Hamlet's execution. Hamlet discovers the plot, outwits his companions, and returns home, more certain than ever that his fate lies in confrontation.

The kingdom rushes toward calamity as Laertes, manipulated by Claudius, challenges Hamlet to a duel. The duel ends in bloodshed, as the royal family dies. With his dying breath, Hamlet entrusts his story to his steadfast friend, Horatio. The stage bears witness to a kingdom destroyed by ambition, deceit, and corruption.
